Littlehampton Town Council is delighted with the progress and results of some of its current projects...



LTC and Arun District Council are preparing to replace the existing Keystone Centre, Eldon Way, Wick, with a brand-new youth centre. Speaking about the initiative, Chair of the Property & Personnel Committee, Councillor Tracey Baker said: "The partnership between the two Councils aims to improve facilities by providing a modern and versatile space, with an enhanced outdoor recreation area, the proposed location is almost opposite the existing Centre. We want the new space to be available to the whole community."

Councillor Ian Buckland, Chair of the Community Resources Committee added: "We are pleased that youngsters and many residents have been closely involved from the start of the consultation. I urge people to visit our website and share their views by completing the online survey at littlehampton-tc.gov.uk/keystone. You have until Friday 8th March to do so. An update will be available in April on the LTC website."

Councillor Mike Northeast said

"These are very exciting times for the Keystone Centre and it is something the management committee have been pursuing for years. The present building is in desperate need of repair and modernisation so hopefully the proposed new build will deliver a youth facility that is much needed and we can all be proud of."



Sea Road Skate Park



Maverick has provided a concept design for the skate park and users were invited to share their views. Suggested amendments are being costed and, if structurally achievable, will be re-imagined in a 3D visual for both Councils to agree, with a project completion date being tipped for late Spring/early Summer.

Town's First Accessible Allotments



A partnership between LTC and housebuilder Barratt Homes, with support from Tesco's Bags of Help Scheme, has seen the Town's first accessible allotments being rented out. Testimony to the Town Council's commitment to ensuring that community facilities are created as the town grows, the new allotments at the Kingley Gate Housing Development were developed with the entire community in mind. Inspired by the need for more accessible public spaces, the design includes raised beds and flat pathways, ensuring that occupants with reduced physical abilities have all-weather access and a consistently stable surface. There are also wheelchair-accessible picnic benches. Further accessible plots are planned in the future as part of the Worthing Road site. Allotment rental enquiries:

Balancing the books: Our Budget 2019/20

The Town Council has agreed its Budget for the forthcoming year and in doing so has protected key services such as allotments, events and grants, whilst also allowing new facilities and services to be brought forward. Key elements of the budget include increased support for the Town Centre retail offer; new allotments; delivering the

proposed Keystone Youth Centre facility and supporting a major piece of work to address a backlog in the documentation of the Museum collection.

Town Council's efficiency drive is just the ticket

Constantly striving to run its services and manage the daily workload as efficiently as possible, LTC has made two new additions to the Amenity Team's resources: a new electric van and an electronic job ticket system. The new van, complete with livery, will be seen out and about as the Amenity Team carries out many of its duties, including buildings and green space maintenance, event support and

graffiti removal.

The new electronic job ticket system is helping the Team schedule outdoor inspections, carry out preventative maintenance and deal with reactive outdoor jobs in a more efficient way. The Team was previously using a combination of paper forms, whiteboards and liaising by telephone to plan their work. The new mobile system allows them to spend more time on the job.

Speaking about the new van Councillor Tracey Baker, Chair of the Property & Personnel Committee, said: "We all want to live in a greener and healthier environment and introducing an electric vehicle is one of a variety of ways we can achieve this aim. When one of our existing vehicles started to come to the end of its life we discussed options for its replacement and choosing a greener vehicle seemed like the best choice."

Grants for local

Do you know a local group that would benefit from a cash boost? If you do, be sure to remind them to apply to LTC's 2019 Grant Aid fund. Continuing to support the Town's local groups and charities, the annual scheme offers funding from a pot of £20,000. Opening the application process on 1st April (closing date is Friday 10th May) Grant Aid awards are made to charitable or not-for-profit clubs, groups or organisations in Littlehampton, Applicants need to demonstrate that their group benefits members of the community by offering cultural enrichment, advice or support, or by providing sporting activities. All applications are considered on the basis of merit, aims and objectives.



A cultural service provided by Littlehampton Town Council, Littlehampton Museum has some exciting projects lined up and is seeking enthusiastic volunteers to help them make - and preserve - local history.

Since January the Museum's Butterworth gallery has been turned into a hub for the documentation of the Museum's fascinating and extensive collection. Comprising more than 30,000 items, the project will involve examining the artefacts, creating a complete inventory of the collection, finding suitable display and storage. Allowing the Museum Team to locate objects immediately, assess their condition, and select new items for

public display, this vital work will also ensure that a wealth of local knowledge from days gone by is available to future generations.

Updates on the work will be shared at the Museum, via the Museum's website and social media channels, but if you would like to get up close and personal with the captivating collection and you have some time to spare, the Team would love to hear from you. Visit the Littlehampton Museum website and complete a volunteer application form (found under 'Collections') or email museum@littlehampton-tc.gov.uk Visitors are welcome to view the Team's ongoing work and to learn more about the processes.

Specialist to advise Museum on Insect, butterfly and moth collection

From Spring this year the Museum team will be using funding secured from the Royal Society's 'Places of Science' Grant Scheme to enlist the help from an external Entomological expert who will provide advice on the care of the Museum's extensive collection of butterfly, moth and insect specimens.

Workshops will run from the Butterworth Gallery involving museum visitors and there will be a series of fun workshops for children during the October Half Term, along with a new temporary display highlighting the Project.

Littlehampton's popular page-turner



Residents turned out in droves to attend and participate in a series of community initiatives held to commemorate the First World War Centenary.

The Remembrance Day Parade and Service held at the War Memorial was reported to be one of the busiest in recent years and, despite the wet and windy weather, hundreds of people attended the special 'Beacons of Light' event on the seafront the same evening.

Also, well received was the LTC installation of nine transparent silhouettes of fallen First World War soldiers in St Mary's Church, which sat alongside a poppy display organised by Derek Moore MBE of the Littlehampton RBL Poppy Appeal.

A special centenary stone was installed at the heart of the Kingley Gate development as a permanent reminder of those who lost their lives in the Great War.



In addition, a Town Councilfunded commemorative book was launched. 'When I Have Done My Bit - Littlehampton and the Great War,' is proving to be a popular title and contains sixty-seven pages of images from the collections of the Littlehampton Museum. Copies are available at Littlehampton Museum priced at £3. Profits will be donated to the SSAFA, the Armed Forces Charity formerly known as Soldiers, Sailors, Airmen and Families Association.

"I'm doubly proud, seeing my idea of the commemorative stones installed and, on the day, seeing my 97-year-old Dad, ex D-Day veteran Stan Northeast unveiling them with the Mayor in the First World War's centenary year.

Mayor Councillor Billy Blanchard-Cooper has been raising funds for Arun Youth Projects (AYP) during his term, specifically for the organisation's two bursaries that provide financial support to young people in Sports, Creative Arts or Social Clubs.

AYP Bursaries offer small sums of money to allow disadvantaged young people to pursue their interests. The bursaries are open to all young local residents aged 11-18 and young people can complete a simple application outlining why they need the bursary and what they would invest it in. Applications are approved by a panel of young advisors selected by democratic process from our youth service.
