1. Virtual Meeting Protocol and Use of Mobile Devices

The Chairman opened the meeting and explained how it would be conducted and the protocol that would be followed, including how any break in the proceedings due to technical difficulties would be managed.

2. Apologies

There were no apologies.

3. Declarations of Interest

Members and Officers were reminded to make any declarations of disclosable pecuniary or personal and/or prejudicial interests that they might have in relation to items on the Agenda. The standing declarations were noted, and no further declarations were made.

4. Chair's Report and Urgent Items

4.1 The Chair reported that this was the first meeting of the Committee since the sad passing of former Chair Councillor Chris Blanchard-Cooper. As indicated at the recent Annual Council meeting, Members would have the opportunity to pay tribute to his service when Council returned to the Chamber.

4.2 The Assistant Town Clerk reported that there were two urgent items which had previously been circulated to the Committee. Members were firstly asked to note and endorse the responses to planning applications that would have been considered at the meetings of this Committee on 30th March and 27th April 2020. These meetings were cancelled following the implementation of restrictions on public gatherings. It was **Resolved** that:

5. Public Forum

- 5.1 In accordance with the Remote Meetings Protocol introduced by the Town Council, members of the public who wished to address the Council or any of its Committees during a remote meeting should have emailed their representations one clear working day before the meeting.
- **5.2** The Chairman reported that one question had been received which he proceeded to read out:

Sarah Tyrrell asked: Is there any action that this committee can take to regularise cycling on the riverside walk? ADC's regulations state that there should be no cycling from 150m down river from the Look and Sea Centre until the Coastguard Tower. The only sign is very small and at least 2m up a lamppost just past the Harbour Master's office (more than 150m from the Look and Sea Centre). Similarly, coming westwards to the river from the seafront, there is a very small sign high up at the junction with the riverside walk.

Cycling has increased enormously during lockdown but discipline and consideration for pedestrians amongst cyclists is variable. Bicycles are very fast and almost silent. If they have bells, they aren't used. Children, dogs, scooters and old ladies do not mix well with bicycles.

There was a serious accident on Sunday when a cyclist came off his cycle close to the lighthouse.

Please could the Council help in asking ADC to enforce the rules and to improve the signage – urgently.

5.3 It was noted that the regulations governing cycling on the Seafront and River walkway were as Mrs Tyrrell had stated. Members acknowledged that cycling had also become more popular since the lockdown increasing activity along

the seafront promenade and river walkway. Although the Town council had no enforcement powers, the Committee shared the concerns that had been expressed regarding signage and the need for better controls to maintain safety for all users in this area. It was agreed that these matters be raised with the District Council and it was therefore **Resolved** that:

A letter be sent to Arun District Council seeking improvements to the signage and action to enforce the regulations regarding cycling on the river walkway.
