# Growing Space for Growing Youngsters

Arun Youth Projects (AYP) continues to expand youth services in Littlehampton with an exciting new initiative in partnership with the Town Council.

An allotment plot has been given to AYP to provide an alternative setting for them to come together, learn new skills and promote good physical and mental health.

Speaking to Progress, Youth Service Manager, Emma Biffi, said: "The overall objective is for the allotment project to become an inclusive community project in partnership with the Town Council. The project will become an integral part of the AYP mentoring offer to promote social interaction and active lifestyles. It will help meet the needs of young people in the community in relation to their social, emotional, and mental health, both as part of an identified need prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, but with a bigger urgency due to the increasing crises that we are seeing young people encounter for the first time."

## New Youth Centre Community Engagement



The Town Council and Arun District Council are preparing to replace the existing Keystone Centre in Wick's Eldon Way with a brand-new youth centre, and they want YOUR views on the masterplan that has been developed for the community facilities.

The initial public survey, conducted in 2019, informed the feasibility study and enabled providers to create a proposal to meet the community's needs. Principal architects Heyler Davies recently revised the proposal, which is now a single storey concept that both reflects these requirements and keeps the project within budget.

A planning application has now been submitted to deliver a new purpose-built youth centre and community hall, multi-purpose games facility and modern children's play area. During November the Town Council will be hosting a number of community engagement events to provide feedback about the proposed redevelopment to inform the detailed design work once the plans have been approved."

"Creative Heart is a love filled, vibrant, community hub and arts café in the heart of Littlehampton," says Felicity Jay, adding that the community organisation is run by the community for the community and offers a safe and inclusive space that tackles loneliness, inspires creativity and improves wellbeing.

"We offer a range of workshops, groups and activities for everybody. We also have a hoist-assisted changing facility, a sensory room, art studios to rent, two large meeting rooms, a hot-desking office, a therapy room and a salon," said Felicity.

An ever-increasing timetable that spans everything from games and crafts to singing and exercise, there is also Friendship Time in the welcoming café, enabling people to meet and make new friends.

Soon adding a Homework Club, thanks to a grant from the Town Council, this is scheduled to run on Wednesdays and Fridays; 3.30 - 4.30pm and will be led by qualified teachers.

"Thanks to the Town Council we have a large screen and some of the laptops needed. This will mean we can provide a safe space for children, who may not have access to technology at home, to come and do their homework and get the advice and support they need," Felicity told Progress.

## New trees for Rosemead Park

Readers may be aware of the Town Council's planning application seeking to replace the group of Leylandii trees on Rosemead Park situated adjacent to the Fitzalan link road.

Nearing the end of their lifespan, it is intended that the existing trees will be replaced by established English native trees and hedgerow that are best suited to coastal conditions and provide a long-term planting scheme that can be enjoyed for years to come.

Offering a sustainable habitat for local wildlife, the new additions will complement the rest of the park's established vegetation and in time provide screening from the road behind. We will be working closely with contractors Apples and Pears, to develop a plan for the management of the scheme which will take into consideration watering, pruning and ongoing maintenance. The project is scheduled to commence in November 2021."
