80. Evacuation Procedures

The evacuation procedures were noted.

81. Filming of Council Meetings, Use of Social Media and Mobile Phones

The procedures were noted.

82. Apologies

There were apologies from Councillor Long.

83. Declarations of Interest

Members and Officers were reminded to make any declarations of disclosable pecuniary or personal and/or prejudicial interests that they might have in relation to items on the Agenda. The standing declarations were noted.

Councillor Tilbrook declared a personal interest in agenda item 8.1, Planning Applications, as a Member of Arun District Council's Planning Committee. He confirmed that when considering the planning applications for Littlehampton, he would do so without predetermination, taking into account the papers that were before him at that meeting.

84. Minutes

The Minutes of the meeting held on 8 November 2021, previously circulated, were confirmed as a true record and signed by the Chair.

85. Chair's Report and Urgent Items

Proposed Fort Road Parking Restrictions - Traffic Regulation Order

The Committee received details of a Traffic Regulation Order – copy attached to the Minutes – which, if implemented, would see the introduction of double yellow lines prohibiting waiting at any time on both sides of the highway at the junction of Fort Road, with Fort Road East. Members proceeded to consider the application in terms of the impact of the change on users of the Town Council's Ford Road allotment site and the potential displacement of vehicles in the surrounding area. The impact on the allotments was thought to be small as most users were local and as ever it was considered that this type of restriction was only effective if was backed up with enforcement. Acknowledging that the application aimed to improve road safety the Committee therefore **Resolved**:

Not to object to the Traffic Regulation Order and that the Committees' comments be forwarded to the County Council.

86. Public Forum

86.1. There were no public present.

Councillor Turner declared a personal interest in the following matter as member of Protect Coastal England, an organisation aligned with the Campaign for the Protection of Coastal Sussex.

- 86.2. The Committee received two written representations relating to the proposed development of the Rampion 2 Windfarm. The first was from the Littlehampton Society and the East Beach Residents Association regarding the Rampion 2 Wind Farm consent process. The committees of both groups wished to ensure that Members had the opportunity to take note and be aware of outcomes from the community-led public meeting on the Rampion 2 consultation and the recent the National Energy Policy Framework consultation. The second was from the Littlehampton Society which sought to make Members aware of a new group, the Campaign for the Protection of Coastal Sussex which would maintain a watching brief on the progress of the Rampion 2 proposals and offer regular updates.
- 86.3 These representations were received and noted by the Committee. Members also recalled that the District Council were commissioning an impact assessment and acknowledged that this would also be a valuable source of information regarding the impact of the development. It was noted that Members would contact these groups direct if they wished to receive their updates.

87. Planning and Other District Council Matters

87.1. Planning Applications – Lists 45, 46, 47 and 48 It was **Resolved** that:

The representations of the Council, appended to these Minutes as Appendix 1, be forwarded to Arun District Council.

87.2. Planning Application LU/252/21/PL - 6 Selbourne Place, Littlehampton

The Committee was requested to review its response to this application in light of the comments from the District Council's Houses in Multiple Occupation Officer, previously circulated. In his response to the application, he had highlighted that whilst the accommodation did meet the minimum standards, it was still lacking in other aspects, namely bathroom provision and windows. It also showed that whilst planning could be approved, this did not guarantee that a Houses in Multiple Occupation license would be granted. This emphasised the importance of engagement in the licensing process for Members of the Committee and it was agreed that this be raised with the District Council. Overall, Members still had significant concerns about the provision in relation to bathrooms and windows and the Committee therefore **Resolved** to:

Maintain its objection to the application and that the comments set out in Minute 87.2. above be forwarded to the District Council.

87.3. Fitzalan Acoustic Barrier

It was noted that a Special Meeting of the District Council's Planning Committee had been called to consider consultant reports regarding the barrier. The Town Council had been invited to make a representation which could be in person or written. The meeting was schedule to take place on 15th December 2021, but the agenda and report had yet to be published. In view of the timescale, it was agreed that the report be circulated to the Committee as soon as it was available and comments collated. It was therefore **Resolved** that:

Authority be delegated to the Town Clerk, in consultation with the Chair, to agree the Committees' response and forward it to the District Council.

88. Review of Strategic Aims and Objectives

The Committee received a report, previously circulated, which set out the Town Council's strategic policies, aims and objectives as they related to the remit of the Committee. These had recently been reviewed to ensure they were relevant and reflected the Priorities of Council. Members proceeded to review theses in more detail and the following updates were noted:

- Connections to the new developments in North Littlehampton would be considered as part of any community and or bus service initiatives.
- The Council would only look to update the Neighbourhood Plan if, through working with the District Council, further sites were identified that both agreed were appropriate for residential development.
- The Heritage Group continued to work on their project regarding updating conservation area statements in the parish.

The Town Council's Planning and Transportation Advisory Group considered this application at their meeting held on Monday 8 November 2021 and object to the application. The Committee acknowledged the steps that had been taken to reconfigure the internal space and that the accommodation met the internal space standards. However, Members considered that despite the Comments from WSCC Highways, the proposals, by virtue of the position of the site and lack of parking provision and onsite turning space, were unsafe and would constitute an adverse impact on the residential amenity of those living in the surrounding area.



Written submission for Planning Committee – 15th December 2021 re: The Fitzalan Link Road Acoustic Barrier, Littlehampton

Thank you to the District Council for convening this meeting and inviting us to make a representation.

On behalf of the Town Council's Planning and Transportation Committee, I would like to begin by thanking the District Council for commissioning a further report on this import matter and our appreciation for the coherent way in which the findings have been presented.

It is clear from the report that a reduction in the height of the current barrier from 3.5m to 2.5m is the only realistic option, especially as the acoustic report, paragraph 3.20, states that this would result in a "minimum perceptible" increase in the level of noise. We therefore support the principle of reducing the height of the barrier and in reaching this conclusion I would add that we do not believe that relocating the barrier is a realistic option due to the disruption this would cause for neighbouring properties and the need to maintain the unimpeded operation of traffic on this new key route in and out of the town.

The strength of public opinion regarding the height of the barrier remains such that we believe that residents would wish to see the local planning and highways authorities work together to address this issue. It would also be best if the developer were engaged in any further discussions as they are on site and have the inhouse expertise to conduct any further works. Clearly, there are complex legal issues that would need to be resolved for this to happen.

We acknowledge however that this will require further work to determine costs and how such an alteration in the height of the fence could be accomplished. We therefore support the recommendation in the report that is before the Planning Committee proposing pursuing a formal modification of the planning permission through an order under Section 102/103 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.

We also remain committed to seeing the overall speed limit on the link road reduced to 30mph and now that it is open, we will be writing to the County Council urging them to begin monitoring traffic and initiate the necessary review.

Speed limit on the Fitzalan Link Road, Littlehampton

I am writing to you following the recent opening of the link road. You will recall our previous correspondence regarding the speed limit and our wish to see it reviewed as a priority. I also believe that the Head Teacher of the Littlehampton Academy has been in contact with the County Council following an accident involving one of their pupils which occurred within a few days of the new road opening.

It is fortunate that the pupil involved in the recent incident was not seriously injured but I hope you will agree that this demonstrates the urgent need for the speed limit to be reviewed. The incident highlighted the nature of the traffic that the Link Road will have to bear, and the volume will only increase as the planned North Littlehampton development grows. This is without taking into consideration that this highway will eventually provide continuity for the Lyminster Bypass.

I am therefore writing to urge you bring forward a review of the speed limit is an immediate priority with a view to reducing to 30mph the speed limit on this stretch of the road and to request that the review findings are shared with us as soon as they are available.

TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDER (TRO) CONSULTATION

NOTICE is hereby given that West Sussex County Council proposes to make two permanent Traffic regulation Orders under the provisions of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as follows:

The first Order proposes to introduce a 20 MPH speed limit on East Street, from Anchor Springs to Beach Road, on Beach Road from East Street to New Road, and on High Street from Beach Road, eastwards for a distance of 25 metres.

This Order also prohibits any vehicle from driving on Duke Street from its junction with High Street northwards for a distance of 24 metres, and on St Martins Lane, from its junction with High Street, northwards for a distance of 24 metres. The Order also consolidates various other traffic restrictions on roads in the surrounding area for housekeeping purposes.

The second Order makes amendments to parking restrictions on various roads in Littlehampton town centre as part of a scheme of highway improvements changing junction layouts and widening pavements on Surrey Street, High Street, Beach Road and East Street. Statement of Reasons for Proposing to Make the Orders

West Sussex County Council proposes to make two permanent Traffic Regulation Orders as part of a major project of public realm improvements in Littlehampton town centre.

The first Order proposes to introduce a 20 MPH speed limit on East Street, from Anchor Springs to Beach Road, on Beach Road from East Street to New Road, and on High Street from Beach Road, eastwards for a distance of 25 metres. This restriction is part of a package of measures to improve the amenity of these roads for pedestrians.

This Order also prohibits any vehicle from driving on Duke Street from its junction with High Street northwards for a distance of 24 metres, and on St Martins Lane, from its junction with High Street, northwards for a distance of 24 metres. These restrictions extend the pedestrianised sections of roads at their junctions with High Street to improve amenity for pedestrians.

In addition to these new measures the Order also consolidates various other traffic restrictions on roads in the surrounding area for housekeeping purposes.

The second Order makes amendments to parking restrictions to accommodate changing junction layouts and widening pavements on Surrey Street, High Street, Beach Road and East Street. The Order changes the layout of existing parking bays on High Street at its junction with Arundel Road and on Beach Road between East Street and New Road.

These changes are intended to accommodate improvements to footways while maintaining the availability of on street parking, and access for loading for businesses in the area.

The new order is therefore proposed to preserve or improve the amenities of the area through which the road runs.

The attached drawings, titled Littlehampton Town Centre Proposed Lining and Signing Sheet 2 of 4, Sheet 3 of 4 and Sheet 4 of 4 (Sheet 1 of 4 shows restrictions being installed at a later date) show an overview of the new restrictions being installed by the proposed Orders.

West Sussex County Council in exercise of their powers under Section 84 (1) a of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act"), and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby make the following Order:-

- 1. This Order shall come into operation on the ***** day of ****** and may be cited as "West Sussex County Council (Littlehampton: High Street and Various Roads) (Traffic Regulation) and (Consolidation) Order 2022".
- 2. The Orders specified in the First Schedule to this Order are hereby revoked.

Interpretation

In this Order –

"Goods Vehicle" means a motor vehicle or trailer constructed or adapted for use for the carriage or haulage of goods or burden of any description.

"Pedal Cycle" means a unicycle, bicycle, tricycle or cycle having four or more wheels not being in any case mechanically propelled, unless it is an electrically assisted pedal cycle that is not treated as a motor vehicle for the purposes of The Act.

"vehicle" means any motor vehicle or pedal cycle.

"Public Service Vehicle" has the same meaning as in Section 1 of the Public Passenger Vehicles Act as Amended.

One Way Traffic

- 4. Save as provided by Articles 5 and 9, no person shall cause or permit any vehicle proceeding in a length of road specified in column 1 of the Second Schedule to this Order, to proceed in a direction other than specified in column 2 of the Second Schedule to this Order.
- 5. Nothing in Article 4 shall apply to a pedal cycle proceeding in a contraflow cycle system in accordance with authorised traffic signs.

Prohibition of Driving Except Goods Vehicles

6. Save as provided by Article 9, no person shall cause or permit any vehicle other than a goods vehicle proceeding for the purposes of loading or unloading, to proceed in the length of road specified in the Third Schedule to this Order.

Prohibition of Driving Except Public Service Vehicles

7. Save as provided by Article 9, no person shall cause or permit any vehicle other than a public service vehicle to proceed in the length of road specified in the Fourth Schedule to this Order.

Prohibition of Driving by All vehicles

8. Save as Provided by Article 9 no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to proceed in the length of road specified in the Fifth Schedule to this Order.

General Exemptions

9. Nothing in Articles 4, 6, 7 and 8 shall apply to:

- a) Any vehicle being used by the Police, Ambulance Service or Fire Brigade in the event of an emergency;
- b) Any vehicle directed to proceed in the affected length of road by a Police Officer in uniform.

20 MPH Speed Limit

- 10. No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to travel at a speed exceeding 20 Miles Per Hour on any length of road specified in the Sixth Schedule to this Order.
- 11. The lengths of roads specified in the Sixth Schedule to this Order shall not be regarded as a restricted road for the purposes of Section 82(2) of the Act.
- 12. Nothing in Article 10 shall apply to a vehicle being used by naval, military or air force purposes while being driven by a person for the timebeing subject to the orders of a member of the armed forces of the Crown on an occasion when
 - (a) the person driving the vehicle is a member of the special forces as defined by the Road Traffic Exemptions (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011; and
 - (b) the vehicle is being driven-
 - (i) in response, or for practice in responding, to a national security emergency by a person who has been trained in driving vehicles at high speeds; or
 - (ii) for the purpose of training a person in driving vehicles at high speeds.

Width Restriction

- 13. Save as provided in Article 14, no person shall cause or permit any vehicle which, including any load it is carrying, measures greater than 6 feet 6 inches in width, to proceed in the length of road specified in the Seventh Schedule.
- 14. Nothing in Article 13 shall apply to:
 - (a) a vehicle being driven in order to load or unload to or from premises adjacent to the lengths of road specified in the Seventh Schedule; or
 - (b) a vehicle used in connection with any building operation or demolition in or on land adjacent to the roads in the Seventh Schedule, or for the removal of any obstruction to traffic in those roads or the laying erection, alteration or repair in or near to those roads of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the provision of gas, water, electricity or telecommunications; or
 - (c) a vehicle being used by the Fire Brigade, Police or Ambulance Services in the event of an emergency.


PAGE 2 OF 2: PROPOSED CHANGES TO RESTRICTIONS (CIRCLED)






