










MEET YOUR NEW COUNCILLORS

Meet our New Town Clerk Laura Chrysostomou



Progress: Congratulations on your appointment as Town Clerk. Will you tell us a bit a bit about your background and career path?

Laura: I was born and raised in London but have lived in Sussex since 2004 and love its historic towns, rolling high school in Wimbledon and did my work experience as a Wimbledon ball girl. The training was tough, but I was honoured to have been chosen for such a prestigious

I started my career working as a manager in Library Services. Inspired by the positive impact libraries can make to a local community I took the opportunity to study and achieve a qualification in management which enabled me to further my career into senior management. One of my proudest achievements was working with the local communities and staff to design fantastic new libraries.

My background in strategic leadership, managing budgets, human resources, community assets and buildings coupled with a passion for improving the quality of life for local communities meant a change of career to working for a Town Council was the Deputy Town Clerk and Responsible Financial Officer and enjoyed five years of working with a committed team of staff and councillors delivering a wide range of services to the community. In 2021 I left Littlehampton to become a Town Clerk in East Sussex. When the opportunity arose to return to

Littlehampton Town Council as the Town Clerk I was very excited and I'm pleased to be back here in Littlehampton working for such a forward thinking, positive and community focussed Council.

Progress: In a nutshell, what does the role of Town Clerk entail?

Laura: The role of Town Clerk is incredibly varied, which is why it appeals to me. The Clerk is the 'proper officer' of the council in law and can be likened to the role of CEO. The Clerk is responsible for advising and supporting councillors in decision making and then taking actions to implement those decisions. This is done through the team of staff employed by the Council, all of whom are managed by the Clerk.

Progress: What elements of the job are you most looking forward to getting to work on?

Laura: We have a great team here at Littlehampton and are lucky to have lots of great new staff recently join us. I am elected councillors over the next four years to shape and deliver the Council's priorities. There are lots of exciting projects and initiatives such as the new K2 community centre, a new community centre in Hampton Park and delivery of the Town Centre Strategy. All of these involve collaborative working, not only between the Town Councillors and staff, but also residents, community groups and other organisations such as the District and County Councils. I believe that with such committed people, who care about our beautiful town, the future aspirations for Littlehampton will continue to make a positive difference.

Progress: What does down time consist of for you?

Laura: My hobby is participating in dog obedience competitions. I train and compete with my German Shepherd dogs and am a Kennel Club qualified judge for such events. It is an unusual sport but training the dogs is so rewarding and keeps me fit. I also love walking on the downs or along the seafront. And in the autumn after a cold walk my guilty pleasure is sitting down in front of the TV with a glass of wine and watching Strictly Come Dancing.

Future Progress: changes to this newsletter

A key part of the Town Council's communication with residents for more than 20 years, the award-winning Progress newsletter covers everything from local news to local events. Originally supplemented by press releases and notice boards, today communication mediums have changed significantly: in 2023 the Town Council website, social media and the e-progress newsletter convey most of the council's messages. This mirrors the experience of mainstream print media, with both local and national newspapers and magazines producing fewer hard copies and increasingly moving their content to virtual platforms.

Following a survey about this newsletter in 2021, in which a questionnaire was distributed with some 14,000 copies of Progress. The return figure was so low that it was statistically almost insignificant. Conversely, the Council had over 10,000 page views of its website, with its Facebook page reaching 26,900 people (with 6,300 'engagements').

And while there have previously been concerns about whether or not the elderly can access media digitally, the research proved that the over 65s are one of the groups that is most connected to the Council's virtual platforms.

Print media is expensive to produce and distribute and creates a huge amount of paper that needs to be recycled. Given the cost of living crisis, which has impacted the Town Council's budget significantly, coupled with a drive to go paperless, it was necessary to explore alternatives - which included ceasing production completely. After careful consideration councillors opted for a reduction in the number of issues (from guarterly to twice-yearly; summer and winter) and replacing the door-to-door distribution with an increased drop-off to public places. Progress will also still be available to view online.

This issue will therefore be the last newsletter to be delivered through letterboxes. In the future, Progress will be at: Town Council Offices, Arun District Council, Littlehampton Library, Wickbourne Centre and Wick Information Centre.





A view of K2



Construction work has begun on a brand-new youth centre on Eldon Way. Named K2 (as a nod to its forerunner The Keystone Centre, so Keystone version 2) contractor Mountjoy is working to a planned completion date of November 2023, with the new facility scheduled to open soon after.

Welcoming use by community groups, the primary focus of the centre will be on local youth provision. Valuing the input of those who will use K2, young leaders from Arun Youth Projects visited the site recently to view the work in progress. Observing the steel frame and initial brickwork in place, alongside a completed 448 sgm multi-use games area, the youngsters also spent time with Gareth Jenkins of Studio Four Architects. Mr Jenkins presented the plans for the interior and encouraged feedback from the young people on layout and colour schemes. The youth leaders also offered invaluable insight into the way in which the space might be utilised, which led to a selection of practical changes within the interior architectural plan.

A partnership project by Littlehampton Town Council and Arun District Council, K2 includes a new 338 sqm playground and will benefit from improvements to the surrounding green space and current BMX track.

If you're old enough to have been a viewer of TV in the 1980s you'll surely remember the smash-hit series The A-Team - "If you have a problem, if no one else can help..."

Here in Littlehampton we have our very own A-Team. Standing for 'Amenity Team', this dedicated workforce undertakes a wide variety of tasks across Littlehampton, supporting the many services overseen by the Town Council and covering four main categories: buildings maintenance, horticulture, events and general community assistance.

With no two days ever being the same, building maintenance spans the Grade II Listed Manor House to the modern purpose built community centre at Southfields Road. Grounds maintenance duties include responsibility for the Town Council's six Allotment sites, Rosemead Park and the various Town Council Venues for hire. Also supporting the Events Team for occasions such as the Town Show and Family Fun Day and Armed Forces Day, the summer months for the A-Team can be especially busy.



Working in partnership with the County Council, through the Street Scene Enhancement Scheme, the A-Team ensures the ongoing attractiveness of the Town and other Parishes in the Eastern Arun area, making sure that unsightly graffiti and fly-posting is swiftly removed. The team also undertakes the painting of street furniture and other work to visually enhance our Town.

So while there's less high-octane adventure than the TV series of the same name, Littlehampton's A-Team remains a force for good - and a force to be reckoned with!
