WE MEAN BUSINESS: New councillors announce four-year plan for the Town.



Following the May 2023 elections and the formation of a new council, councillors have now undertaken an extensive induction programme and created a comprehensive list of actions.

Comprising seven returning and eight new councillors (of which nine represent the Labour Party and six the Liberal Democrats), all fifteen councillors have received the appropriate training, as well as participated in a far-reaching planning session for the four-year term. The resulting Business Plan has now been drawn up, encapsulating not just objectives, but also outlines for their delivery.

Confirming a collective will to work collaboratively with the public and partners to ensure better outcomes for all, the new council's mission statement promises to



Listen, represent and lead the town by actively encouraging engagement, community and tourism.

The council also confirmed that they intend to be reliable, publicly accountable and resourceful.

Looking to develop a multi-centred sustainable town, with safe vibrant places for people to come together, aims include the completion of the new K2 Community Centre, and also commencing work on a similar centre in the development North of Littlehampton.

Championing community engagement and a culture of mutual support for all, plans also include the exploration of opportunities for enhanced accessibility, such as coordinating a multiagency community stall once a month at the Friday market. Keen also to ensure that accessible environmentally-friendly services are wide-reaching, the council has committed to 'Improving Littlehampton, strengthening and empowering the community'.

A Force for Good

Having been in Littlehampton as a PCSO for the last six weeks, Martyn Robinson says that he loves being out on patrol and meeting people.

It was the community aspect that drew me to the role in the first place, and I do get to meet members of the community; from members of the public to those working in the businesses on the High Street. It's important to understand people's views and concerns, so I'm always happy to have a chat and to see if we can help.

Stressing the importance of reporting issues, Martyn added:



Reporting is really important. Sometimes we may need to build up a picture or a pattern of an ongoing issue, so even if it is something that has been reported previously, we do ask that people continue to report. It can really help.

Highlighting recent incidents of street drinking (and the subsequent antisocial behaviour), Martyn explained that PCSOs aim to work not just with those whose behaviour raises concern, but also with those retailers that might be selling alcohol to those already visibly under the influence.



The High Street should be a space that everyone can enjoy and working together gives us the best chance of making sure that it is.

And in the coming months the number of PCSOs in our town will increase, as newly trained recruits join the ranks. Providing a reassuring presence on the local streets, Officers will continue to be on patrol regularly and are, says Martyn, very approachable.



Do come and say hello to us if you see us out and about. You don't have to have something to report - we want, and enjoy, getting to know the community.

COMPLETING K2

A brand new facility for the local community, construction of the new K2 centre is nearing completion. The scaffolding has been removed, with the focus now on the internal aspects of the project.

Instrumental in guiding some of the decisions about the creation of K2, Arun Youth Projects have helped to ensure the space will not only offer young people the best possible resources, but that the building will also meet their aspirations and needs.

Work is scheduled for completion by the end of the year, with interest from potential hirers already being generated.

A Strategy for **Our Town Centre**

Littlehampton Town Centre provides residents and visitors with essential retail outlets, public and private services and leisure space. But regeneration is key to ensuring that this core aspect of our Town continues to improve and thrive.

Working in partnership on a Strategy for the Town Centre for the past year, Littlehampton Town Council consulted with the public, seeking their views on the regeneration of the town. Resulting in an Action Plan, the Town Council will now lead a newly-formed Town Centre Action Group (TCAG), made up of Town, District and County Council councillors and staff, the Police, business and landlord representatives, in delivering this.

THE FIVE STRATEGIC OBJECTIVES

To work in partnership to formulate an action plan that encourages an attractive, welcoming, and thriving town centre for our businesses, community, and visitors. Example of an Action: Utilise a grant from the UK Shared Prosperity Fund to appoint an experienced company to link the business community and local authorities strengthening the role that each can play to achieve a thriving town centre. To ensure that the town centre has a welcoming, safe, and attractive physical environment that supports the needs of both businesses and town centre users, enables delivery of a range of events and activities and provides a focus for a healthy and thriving community. Example of an Action: To encourage and facilitate a range of activities and events to be held in the Town To improve the commercial viability of the town centre for existing and potential new businesses. Example of an Action: To bring more leisure and hotel facilities into the town and encourage restaurants to open in the town centre. To ensure that town centre accessibility is inclusive, supports all modes of transport and meets the needs of all users. Example of an Action: Review the disc parking scheme and improve transport links to and from the Town Centre and wider town. To improve interconnectivity between the Town Centre, seafront, riverside and wider town, making access to business areas and tourist attractions much easier. Example of an Action: Look to improve the offer of information for visitors to the Town Centre and to

We were keen to bring festive cheer to Littlehampton whilst ensuring that the financial implications were considered carefully in light of the ongoing cost of living crisis.

The new scheme was selected for its sustainability with LED lights and eco-friendly options where possible. We have replaced the real Christmas tree with an artificial tree made up entirely of lights, we have added two hanging motifs that will welcome visitors to the High Street and one decoration that will see people walk through it. In addition there will be motifs on lampposts and lights hanging across the pedestrianised precinct. It will be fantastic to see a whole new set of illuminations this year.

Grant aid: The results are in!

Twenty-seven local organisations benefitted from this year's Town Council Grant Aid awards scheme.

Supporting a broad range of services and activities, all aimed at helping local residents, a total pot of £15,000 was shared amongst the beneficiaries. These included homeless charity Turning Tides, which was awarded £925 to purchase raised beds and gardening tools.

Elise Cooper, Employment and Skills Worker at Turning Tides said:



"The funding we received from Littlehampton Town Council has enabled us to develop an underused space into a mini allotment for our community. We have been able to buy tools and equipment to meet the diverse needs of our service users making it accessible for everyone to take part in and enjoy!"



Other beneficiaries include Arun Counselling Centre (to provide free counselling sessions to residents), Lifecentre (for support sessions for male survivors in Littlehampton) and Littlehampton Football Club (for the purchase of new kit for the under 18s girls team).
