51. Statement

Councillor Richards addressed the Committee on the Grenfell Tower disaster. Before the Committee looked at the plan lists Councillor Richards asked that Members take a moment to remember all those effected by the Grenfell Tower disaster in 2017. This was tragic event and observing that the final report by the Public Inquiry dealing with the root causes of the fire had just been published, Councillor Richards felt it important that Members should not lose sight of the importance of safety in building plans when considering planning matters.

54. Apologies

There were apologies from Councillors Long and Woodman, Councillor Tilbrook attended as a substitute for Councillor Woodman.

Members and Officers were reminded to make any declarations of disclosable pecuniary or personal and/or prejudicial interests that they might have in relation to items on the agenda. The standing declarations were noted, and no further declarations were made.

56. Minutes

The Minutes of the meeting held on 12 August 2024 were confirmed as a true record and signed by the Chair.

57. Chair's Report and Urgent Items

57.1. Licence Application Number: 120140 - Strobilus Cafe LTD 31 High Street Littlehampton, BN17 5EG

The Committee had before it an application for a pavement licence at the above premises on the High Street, copy attached to the minutes. Members were supportive of the proposals.

It was resolved that:

58. Public Forum

There were no members of the public present, and no representations made.

59. Planning and other Arun District Council Matters

59.1. Standing Orders / Urgent Action

Members had before them a standing order, which had been previously circulated, confirming the decision not to object to the renewal of the pavement license for Greggs on the High Street, application reference number 120063.

60. Changes to the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF)

It was noted that the Town Council's response to the consultation on proposed reforms to the NPPF and other changes to the planning system would be considered by the Policy and Finance Committee on 16 September. This was to allow time to review the Local Planning Authority's assessment of the proposals which would be published shortly. Members were reminded that all councillors were invited to make representations during the public forum session of that meeting and that if they were unable to attend, to send their comments to the Assistant Town Clerk who would collate them and share them with the committee.

61. Rampion 2 Windfarm

There was nothing further to report.

62. Proposals to close The Church of St James the Great, Littlehampton

The Committee received notification of the above proposals from the diocese of Chichester, previously circulated. This was the start of a consultation process pending a decision on the future of the Church which it was observed currently hosted the Community Fridge. It was thought that the Church had been deconsecrated and although no longer used as a place of worship, it remained a valuable community space. The Committee therefore hoped that any future decision on its future would take this into account.

It was therefore resolved that:

The Committee's views as set out above be sent to the diocese.

63. West Sussex County Council and other Highways Matters

63.1. A27 Arundel Bypass

It was reported that following the Chancellor's announcement on 21 August 2024, the Bypass would not be taken forward and that National Highways were bringing the project to a close. In noting this, the Committee also observed that the Lyminster bypass was due to be completed at the end of the year.

It was resolved that:

The update be noted.

63.2. Transport for the Southeast

Members had before them a link to the Transport for Southeast website which set out the findings from their recent survey on public transport. Commending the report to Members, the Chair reported that it highlighted the very desperate need for expansion and improvements to public transport infrastructure in this part of the country.

63.3. Flood Investigations

- 63.3.1. Members had before them a report, previously circulated, which set details of a questionnaire launched by the County Council. This sought information from residents on the flooding experienced during Storm Kathleen in April 2024. River Ward councillors reported that having spent time talking to residents on the West Bank who were most affected, that a key issue had been the lack of notice that the storm was escalating. It had subsequently come to light that the Environment Agency flood warning system relied on electronic communications which some residents were unable to access.
- 63.3.2. Members considered that this demonstrated a flaw in the EA protocols that needed to be addressed, even if it meant instigating letter drops to areas at risk, Members considered that this could still be the only way some residents would know that there was a risk and what to do. Members also hoped that the County Council had written to residents on the West Bank with details of this questionnaire to ensure that everyone effected had the opportunity to respond.

It was therefore resolved that:

The Committee's views as set out in minutes 63.3.1. and 63.3.2. above be sent to the County Council.

There was nothing further to report.
